
HOLE PAR 4 HDCP 3/2

This starting hole sets a tone for the strategy that is required for the success of your round. There is ample room (40-60 yards) between the right side of the bunker and the left hillside bunkers. The best view of the green is from right side of fairway. Your second shot is played 40-50 feet downhill with a left side run-up approach also possible.

Enjoy the view from the elevated tees and be comforted by the 50 yards between the center of the green and the end of the huge bunker before you. With up to a 50-foot change in elevation from tee to green, select at least one less club than the yardage indicates.




Length matters less on this strategic, short par 4. The safe approach is an iron played left and short of the bunkers. A more aggressive approach is a fairway metal or driver from the tee over the bunkers. On your approach, beware of a low area on the right side of the green that tends to collect off line shots.

A characteristic that is prevalent throughout Shepherd's Hollow is the use of directional or aiming bunkers. If you go for the green you must carry the bunkers down the left side. If you decide to lay-up, you must still contend with these bunkers if you want a view of the putting surface for your approach shot. The saucer shaped green funnels shots to its center.




A staight forward driving hole. Favor the right side of the fairway for the best approach to the green that moves from front right to back left. The green is two-tiered with the high side in the front. Precise distance control is essential to getting the ball close.

The fairway bunkers present you with two strategic options. You can take the aggressive route by flying over them and shortening your second shot or drive the ball to the center of the fairway that moves left to right. If you cannot safely reach the green on your second shot, lay-up 20 yards short of the green and pitch from there.

Beautiful and reachable describes this par 5. Your tee shot should be center to left center. Pick your perfect lay-up yardage to a wide area 100 yards short or challenge the small elevated green protected by two deep bunkers. Approach to the left center of the green to gain a greater margin of error.

Another example of scorecard yardage being relative. A 40-55 foot drop to the green indicates one less club once again. There is no run-up shot here. Green slopes from right to left. Do not go over this green.




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


A solid drive is required here to reach the crest of this uphill fairway from which you can attack this slight right to left bending par 4. The back left portion of the green offers a backstop. If you miss this green, miss in the fairway short or in the left greenside bunker for best opportunity to make par. Don't miss this green to the right.









This hole requires you to keep your tee shot in the left-to-left center of the fairway allowing for a slight roll to the right. Another green 40 feet below the teeing ground provides an opportunity to score on a long par 4. This green allows the player to bounce or run-up a shot from the left side to the green.

HOLE PAR 4 **HDCP 3/3**

This hole demands length and accuracy from the back tees. The safe play is short of the fairway bunker. A more aggressive play over the hill and to the right of the bunker affords the player the best view of the green. Your approach shot must navigate a slightly elevated green, which features a false front.







HOLE 12 PAR 3 HDCP 8/8

Straight forward, secluded and solid describes this par 3 that plays every inch of its yardage. A ravine to the right, which balances the troublesome left side bunkers, frames a large green that does allow for a run up shot.

HOLE PAR 5 HDCP 2/1

Don't let the water consume your focus, the bunkers that frame the right side require a tee shot to their left. Your second shot should reach the plateau 100 yards short of the green. A collection area short and left of the green requires a long approach shot to skirt the right side bunkers.

Hit your tee shot between the bunkers if you choose, but the best play is to allow for a second shot of 100 yards. Factor in up to a 35-foot elevation change to this long narrow green.

HOLE 15 PAR 4

HDCP 7/7

This hole is strategy at its best. If you play short of the right hand fairway bunker to the widest, safest portion of the fairway, you will only see the top of the flag. The safest play is left of the bunker, or the gambling play is to try to carry the right side bunker which could leave your ball just in front of the green. But don't be long on this hole, driver may be too much club here.

HOLE 16 PAR 4 HDCP 4/5

No matter which tee you play, the right center tee shot is essential; anything left of center will move left to a collection area that requires a recovery rather than scoring opportunity. Your second shot is all carry with another green featuring a false front.

This par 3 features a green that is more than twice as long as it is wide. Distance control is paramount as the large mound in the center of the green separates the two distinct putting areas, making a two-putt precarious. The right side of the hole is dryer than the left.

This scenic par 5 provides the golfer a multitude of options. Our choice is to aim at the left side fairway bunker and let it rip. That bunker is farther than you think. If you choose to go for the green in two, you are confronted with a multi-tiered green that requires proper club selection and an accurate approach.

This wide fairway requires you to stay left of the right side fairway bunkers and to hug the right side of the fairway to shorten this lengthy dogleg right. The green is also more than twice as deep as it is wide and offers left side support that allows for a fade or run-up shot in lieu of flying the greenside bunker.

PAR 5
HDCP 1/1

From the back tees aim directly at the large rock dead center of the fairway. From the other tees, the directional bunker is your aiming point. This is a three shot hole even with a 70-foot drop from tee to green. Your second shot left 100 yards from the green is the perfect lay-up position. Be aggressive on your third shot.





The green shape provides the strategy to the hole; select the right club for the yardage and hit it that distance. If the pin is located in the front right depression, a two is very much in play. If the pin is front left or back right, play for par.









Long hitters may give this one a try, but you still must navigate the bunker in the landing area. Tee shots to the right side of fairway are the easiest, but then present the player the most difficult approach angle into the green. Good wedge players will want to lay-up just left of the center fairway bunker. The green has two tiers.


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PAR 3

PAR 3 HDCP 6/8

Enjoy another stunning view from the top of the back tees. This is a big par 3 with a huge undulating two-tier green that sits 40-60 feet below the teeing grounds. Although the player is forced to carry a hollow short of the green, the right side approach does allow for a bounce up.

This tree lined par 5 plays to its distance, but can be reached in two. Your tee shot should land left side of the lone fairway bunker. To hit the green in two requires you to carry the left side bunker guarding the second fairway landing area. For your best angle of approach and chance at birdie, lay-up just short and just right of fairway bunker.



This challenging par 4 puts a demand on the player to be long and accurate on both the tee shot and the approach. Get close to the end of the fairway to shorten your approach. This large undulating green requires the player to place the approach shot in the proper quadrant of the green for those seeking threes, but also those looking for par.
